October 4, 2023 7:00 p.m. City Hall 444 S 1st Avenue Mill City, Oregon

Present: Jason Bradshaw, Laura Bradshaw, Braeden Cook, Stacie Cook, Becky Van Atta and Ron Van Vlack.

<u>Minutes</u>: Becky Van Atta moved, seconded by Jason Bradshaw to approve the minutes of September 6, 2023. The motion passed.

Budget Sample: Mrs. Cook provided a copy of the General Fund budget documents for review, explaining that 4th of July revenues and expenditures are included in the miscellaneous category within the budget.

<u>Fee Schedule</u>: Mrs. Cook provided the fee schedule for 4th of July events stating that if there are any changes or additions that the Committee would like to recommend they should be incorporated fairly soon as the resolution must be approved by the Council.

Mr. Bradshaw said that the fees should be raised since this year will be a three-day event. Mrs. Cook suggested that the resolution be modified to allow for a multi-day fee schedule.

Chair Braeden Cook asked the Committee to review the fee schedule and be prepared to discuss and make a recommendation at the November meeting.

<u>Map Layout of Events</u>: Chair Cook asked that a date be set at the November or December meeting to meet at Kimmel Park so that the Committee can have a first hand understanding of the space before a decision is made about the event layout.

Parade Route/Staging Map: Chair Cook briefly went through the parade route and staging for last year's event, stating that if there are any suggestions for changes they should be brought up to the group.

Mrs. Cook said that while it may not work due to the hill on S 1st Avenue, the Committee could consider lining the parade up on SW Ivy Street.

<u>Event Activities Decision:</u> The Committee went through possible events for the 4th of July Celebration. The following were determined to be a possibility or certainty.

Mrs. Van Atta said that the events need to be organized to determine the amount of manpower necessary for each then volunteer recruitment will be easier.

Mrs. Cook said that the school's Leadership group should be contacted about volunteering as each student involved must complete a certain number of volunteer hours each year.
